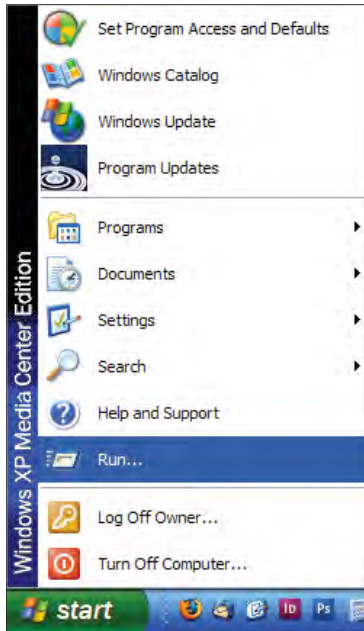




# FAQ #19: Setting BobCOST File Permissions in XP

## Windows XP Home, Professional and Media Center Edition Setup

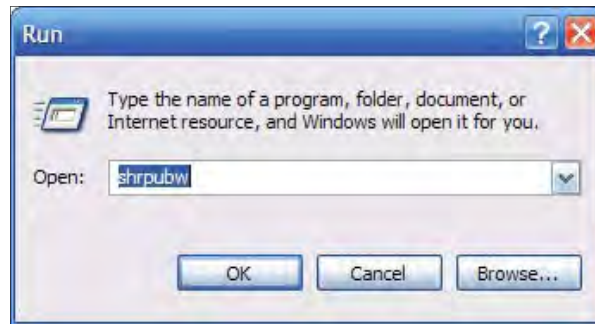
Click on the Start menu in the lower left corner of the screen. In the menu that appears, click on “Run...”



In the box that will appear, type in:

shrpwbw

.. and then click OK or press the enter key.

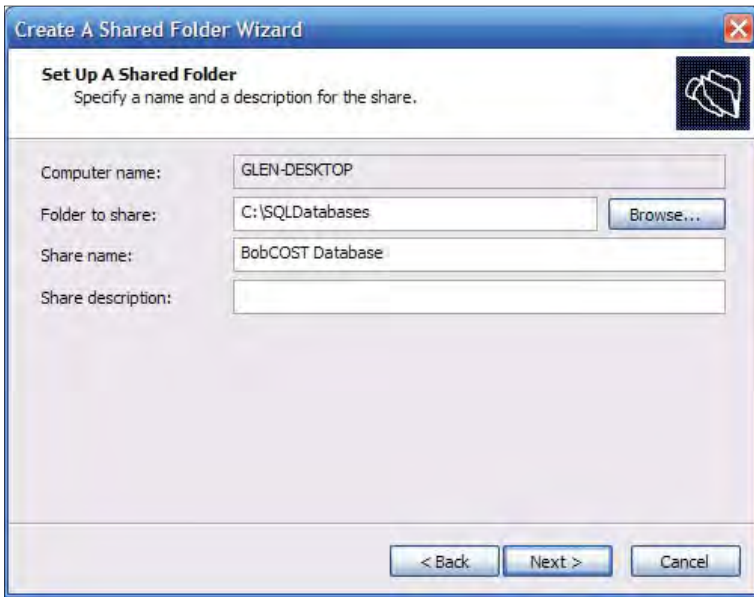


The Windows XP file sharing wizard will appear.



Click Next to proceed.

In the next box to appear, click the “Browse...” button and browse to the SQLDatabases file created in the previous step. In “Share Name” type in any name that makes sense. In the example below, the name “BobCOST Database” was used.

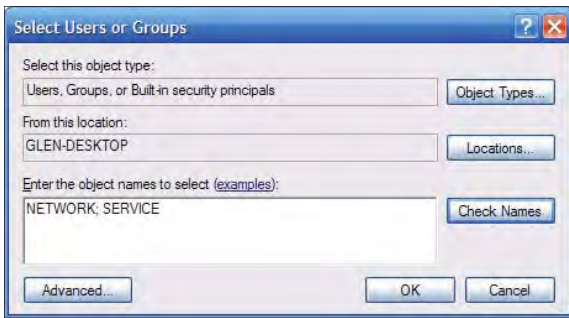


Click “Next” to continue. In the next box, click on the “Customize Permissions” option as shown and then click on the “Custom...” button.

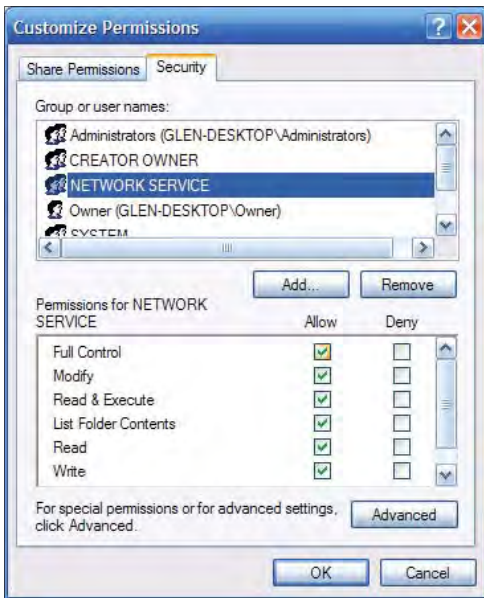


In the Users list in XP Professional and XP Media Center Edition, scroll to “NETWORK SERVICE” and click on it to choose it. If it does not exist, click on the “Add” button and in the dialog that will appear, type in “NETWORK SERVICE” in the box and click OK. The name will then be in the list and will be available.

In XP Home, click on the “Add” button and type in “NETWORK; SERVICE” instead as shown on the next page. XP Home uses a different set of service user names than XP Professional and XP Media Center Edition do. The semicolon “;” separates the names of two different users in XP Home. Click OK.



Now that the appropriate users are in the list, click on “NETWORK SERVICE” under XP Professional and XP Media Center Edition and choose the “Allow” checkbox in the same row as “Full Control” as shown below.



In XP Home, do the same for the “NETWORK” and “SERVICE” users both. Click OK on this dialog to return to the main wizard. Click “Next” in the box. Click “Finish” in the last dialog and the folder permissions setup will be complete.
